



## City electricity program notification of automatic enrollment

You are receiving this notice because your electricity account is eligible for **AUTOMATIC ENROLLMENT** in Framingham Community Electricity.

Your electricity account number is shown on the enclosed reply card.

**Framingham Community Electricity** is a group electricity buying program from the City of Framingham. The program provides stable prices, cleaner electricity, and consumer protections.

### Participating in Framingham Community Electricity means:

- The supply price on your Eversource electric bill will change to **12.818 ¢/kWh**, which is **lower** than Eversource's current residential Basic Service price and fixed until March 2027.

*Eversource's prices change and future prices are unknown, so future savings compared with Eversource cannot be guaranteed.*

- 35% of your electricity will come from new renewable sources in the New England region.
- You will remain an Eversource customer, and Eversource will continue to deliver your electricity and send your electric bill.

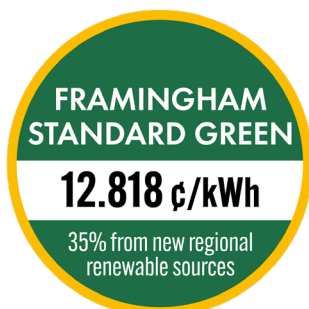

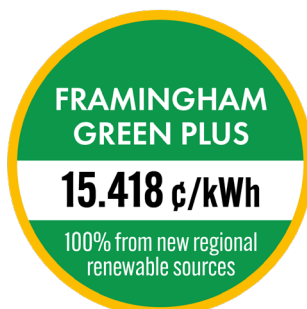

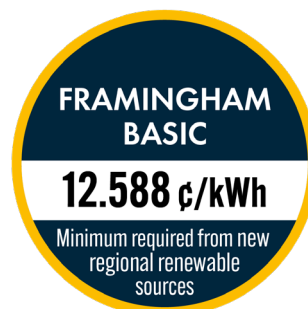

To avoid automatic enrollment, submit your opt-out request by **November 3, 2025**. Or you may try the program and opt out at any time in the future.

\* The total renewable energy from MA Class I sources for both the Standard Green and Green Plus options will remain constant for each year of the electricity supply contract, 35% and 100% respectively. As the amount of MA Class I RECs required by state law increases from year to year, the amount purchased voluntarily by Framingham will decrease.

\*\* State law requires all electricity suppliers to purchase Renewable Energy Certificates (RECs) from other sources, including sources that are not new, are renewable but not clean, such as waste to energy, or are clean but not renewable, such as nuclear. This purchase must be made even if the total amount of RECs purchased from either clean or renewable sources exceeds 100% of the electricity used by program participants.

## Additional information:

### Your electricity supplier will be First Point Power.

On your bill, you will see "First Point-FraminghamCommunity Elec." But your primary relationship for electricity remains with Eversource, and you will continue to call them if your power goes out. In addition, Eversource will continue to send your electric bill, and this is the only electric bill you will receive as a participant in Framingham Community Electricity.

**If you are eligible for a low-income discount or fuel assistance,** those benefits will continue in Framingham Community Electricity.

**If you have solar panels on your property or you participate in a community solar program,** you will continue to receive solar credits and/or solar incentive payments, and participating in Framingham Community Electricity will not change how they are calculated.

**If you have a tax-exempt account,** you are responsible for requesting an exemption from the collection of any tax by providing appropriate tax-exemption documentation to First Point Power. Visit FraminghamCommunityElectricity.com to learn more.

**If you have received this notice and also you have signed a contract with an electricity supplier,** you may have signed your contract after this mailing list was created. To continue receiving electricity from the supplier you chose and prevent any early termination fees from that supplier, **you must opt out of Framingham Community Electricity.**

**The automatic enrollment model is in accordance with state law.** More than 200 cities and towns in Massachusetts have similar programs, and all operate the same way. However, you are not required to participate. You may opt out at any time with no fee or penalty.

**At the end of the contract with First Point Power,** the City intends to sign a new long-term contract. The electricity supplier and renewable energy content may change, and the price may be higher or lower than the current price. You will continue in the same program option at the new price unless you inform Framingham otherwise. The City will provide advance notice of any such changes, and you will be free to opt out or change your option before the changes take effect.

The envelope must be postmarked by **November 3, 2025**, to opt out of the program before being automatically enrolled.
