



## An important message from the Town of Sherborn about a change in your electricity supply price

May 4, 2026



### Your Sherborn Power Choice price will change in June.

Your electricity account is enrolled in Sherborn Power Choice, our Town's group electricity buying program. Through the program, you receive a Sherborn Power Choice price for the Supply portion of your electric bill. Under state law, enrollment in Sherborn Power Choice occurs automatically for most electricity customers.

You are enrolled in the **Sherborn Standard** option, which is the default option and which provides an additional 50% of your electricity from renewable sources.

In June 2026, your electricity supply price will change as current program prices expire and a new contract with Direct Energy Services, LLC ("Direct Energy") takes effect. Electricity prices have increased since the current prices were secured in 2024, so your new price will be higher than your current price.

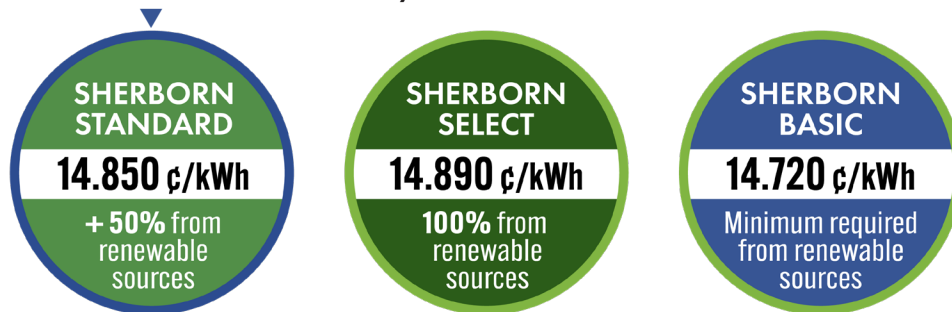
- ▶ Your price will change from 14.046 ¢/kWh to **14.850 ¢/kWh**.  
Your new price was selected from a pool of competitive bids with the goal of providing stability in volatile times and is fixed for 30 months from June 2026 until **December 2028**.
- ▶ Eversource's prices have also increased, and your new price will be **lower** than Eversource's current residential price of 15.629 ¢/kWh and small business price of 15.030 ¢/kWh. *Future savings compared with Eversource cannot be guaranteed.*
- ▶ On your bill, your electricity supplier will change to "Sherborn Power Choice-Direct Energy," but Eversource will continue to deliver your electricity, send your bill, and address power outages.

### It's your decision. Make the choice that's right for you.

If you want to continue participating: **No action is required.** Your enrollment in the Sherborn Standard option will renew automatically at 14.850 ¢/kWh in June, and you will see the new price on your July Eversource electric bill.

If you want to change to a different program option: Choose the Sherborn Select option to receive all of your electricity from renewable sources. Choose the Sherborn Basic option to receive the lowest price in the program.

Your enrollment will renew here automatically



If you want to leave the program: You are free to opt out with no fee or penalty and receive Eversource's current electricity supply price or sign your own contract with an electricity supplier.

\* In addition to purchasing the renewable energy shown in the table, the program’s electricity supplier is required by state law to purchase renewable energy certificates (RECs) from other clean or renewable sources. This purchase must match 39% of participants’ electricity use.

**Additional information:**

- **If you recently signed a private electricity supply contract and also you received this notice**, this mailing list may have been created before you signed your contract. **If you wish to remain in your contract, you should opt out of Sherborn Power Choice.** Opt out online at [SherbornPowerChoice.com](http://SherbornPowerChoice.com) or by calling customer support with the Town’s program consultants at 855-201-6233.
- **If your account is tax exempt**, you must submit your tax-exemption documentation to Direct Energy. Tax-exemption documentation must be submitted each time the program’s electricity supplier changes. - **At the end of the new contract with Direct Energy**, the Town intends to sign another long-term contract. The electricity supplier and renewable energy content may change, and the price may be higher or lower than the current price. You will continue in the same program option at the new price unless you inform the program otherwise. The Town will provide advance notice of any such changes, and you will be free to opt out or change your option before the changes take effect.
- **Voluntary renewable energy purchased through the program** will now be purchased from wind projects outside of New England instead of from renewable sources within New England as a result of changes in the renewable energy landscape. The goal of purchasing local renewable energy was to build demand for the development of new renewable energy projects on our local grid. However, because of changes at the federal level, it has become difficult to build new renewable energy projects. As a result, for now, the extra cost associated with voluntarily purchasing additional renewable energy from our region cannot be justified. Purchasing renewable energy from wind projects outside of New England ensures that the program can continue to offer options that exceed state minimum renewable energy requirements, but at more cost-effective prices.
